

How a Man Conveys Interest

Some of the following cues aren't gender-specific, since both males and females use them. It is important to note, however, that males and females can be very different in their snaps. Although this discussion is addressed mainly to women, if you're a man you can use these cues to signal your interest to a woman.

He lifts his eyebrows. When a man sees someone he's into, he automatically lifts and lowers his eyebrows, wrinkling his forehead in the process. But you'll have to keep your eyes peeled to catch a glimpse of this telltale signal. Anthropologists call it the eyebrow flash because, like a bolt of lightning in the night sky, it moves across the face quickly.

He stands with his legs spread apart. Men want to show themselves at their alpha-male, leader-of-the-pack best. A guy will often stand with his legs spread apart and pelvis facing you when he's attracted to you. It's a primal, biological instinct, and most men don't even know they're doing it.

He stands or sits with his toes pointed toward each other. This means he's feeling a little unsure of himself; he's interested but needs reassurance that the interest is mutual.

He tilts his head slightly to the side when your eyes meet. Just as it is for a woman, the head tilt is a subconscious come-hither signal that the guy is attracted to you. So if the man you've been sharing glances with gives you the head tilt, that's your cue he is interested but possibly a bit shy.
